From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Today's Solemnity of Corpus Christi (the Body and Blood of Christ) provides us an opportunity for the joyous celebration of the gift of the Eucharist that would be out of character on Holy Thursday, which is overshadowed by the impending passion and death of Our Lord. The feast, a product of the Eucharistic movement of the 12th and 13th centuries, was first celebrated in Liege in 1247.

The Council of Trent went on to say, centuries later, that the purpose of Corpus Christi was to arouse gratitude in the hearts of the faithful and to remind them of their common Lord. Pope Benedict XVI, reflecting on this teaching, provides us with three points of our own meditation. Corpus Christi is celebrated:

✓ **To counter our forgetfulness**—How often in our familiarity with the celebration of the Mass, we forget the awesome gift that the Lord has given us. Routine can be the death of reverence. Let us do all we can to cultivate that awe and reverence that should characterize our parish: silence for prayer, active participation at Mass, observance of the hour fast, careful reception of Holy Communion, witnessing to our belief in the Lord's presence by our bow and genuflection. How often we need to think of the importance of the words we use. Often we hear ourselves referring to the Blessed Sacrament as Bread and Wine, rather than "Sacred Body" and "Precious Blood" that is the reality after the Consecration of the Mass.

✓ **To elicit our thankfulness**—The gift of Christ Himself in the Eucharist should stir within us sentiments of profound gratitude. Our Communion allows us to receive within our own bodies, the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ. We need to consider our attitudes before and after our reception of the Holy Eucharist. How often the Holy Father has called us to be attentive to being properly disposed, that is to say, in the "state of grace" before receiving Communion. Approaching the altar for Holy Communion requires our sincere and honest discernment. The Sacrament of Penance is the privileged way to prepare for our Eucharistic encounter.

✓ **To foster our fellowship**—Unity is a mark of the Church. Our reception should elicit in us sentiments of love for our brothers and sisters. We should seek that which brings us together. There should be no divisions around the Table of the Lord's Sacrifice. Whenever this is lacking, we must first pass through the doors of reconciliation, pardon, forgiveness, before coming to receive the Lord's Body and Blood. May we, who are as Catholics a Eucharistic People, always **remember**, be always **grateful**, and of **one mind and heart**.
