Dear Parishioners:

Today the "ordinal" Sundays after Pentecost are interrupted by the great Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. As we honor these "great columns" of the Church for their witness to the faith, let us renew our own love and devotion to the Church founded by Christ. Perhaps the prayer below can provide a basis for our prayer on this great day. They are the words of the Servant of God, Paul VI, who reigned as Pope from 1963 to 1978 and oversaw the completion and implementation of the norms of the Second Vatican Council. Pope Benedict has rightly called him the "steady helmsman of Christ's Church."

*Saints Peter and Paul,  
Who carried the name of Christ into the world, and offered Him your utmost witness of love and of blood, continue to protect this Church, for which you lived and died.*

*Preserve her in truth and in peace.  
May all her children grow in fidelity to the word of God, in holiness through a Eucharistic and sacramental life in the serene unity of faith, in charity for one another, and in helpful obedience to its pastors.*

*May the Church continue to be in the world, a living, joyous, and effective sign of the redemptive design of God and of His Covenant with mankind.*

*Watch over this blessed Church by your intercession, now and always, until the definitive and blessed encounter with the Lord when He comes.

Patriotism is a love for everything to do with our native land: its history, its traditions, its language, its natural features. It is a love which extends also to the works of our compatriots and the fruits of their genius. Every danger that threatens the overall good of our native land becomes an occasion to demonstrate this love.

The native land is the common good of all citizens and as such it imposes a serious duty. The native land . . . is a complex reality . . . cultural and historical identity of any society is preserved and nourished by all that is contained within this concept of nation. Clearly, one thing must be avoided at all costs: the risk of allowing this essential function of the nation to lead to an unhealthy nationalism. Of this, the twentieth century has supplied some all too eloquent examples, with disastrous consequences. How can we be delivered from such a danger? I think the right way is through patriotism. Whereas nationalism involves recognizing and pursuing the good of one's own nation alone, without regard for the rights of others, patriotism, on the other hand, is a love of one's native land that accords rights to all other nations equal to those claimed for one's own. Patriotism, in other words, leads to a properly ordered social love.
