### ***Mission Speaker Coming Next Week***

Saint Patrick's Missionary Society (also known as the Saint Patrick Fathers) was formally established 75 years ago on March 17, 1932. Irish diocesan priests who had gone to work on a temporary basis in Nigeria, West Africa, but who afterwards wished to dedicate their lives to the missions founded the Society. Later, as the new missionary society grew, more work was undertaken, not only in Nigeria, but also in Kenya (1951), Brazil (1962), Malawi (1970), Grenada (1970), Zambia (1973), Sudan (1983), Zimbabwe (1989), Cameroon (1989), South Africa (1989), and Rwanda (1994).

There are now 320 priests in the Society with 69 seminarians preparing for the priesthood in its formation houses in Nigeria, Kenya, Zambia, South Africa, and Brazil.

The priests of the Society respond to every need of the missions, so although most members work in a pastoral role, many are also occupied with educational, medical, agricultural, and other social development projects.

The Society has no means of training its seminarians and supporting its priests other than the donations it receives.

The second collection next week will be the Missionary Cooperation Plan appeal for the Saint Patrick Fathers. Please be as generous as your means allow. Thank you.

### **Important Notice about Our Envelopes**

The quarterly printing and mailing of our offering envelopes is a significant expense. All parishioners are encouraged to use the envelopes, which enable the parish to verify weekly giving for tax purposes and serve as an indicator of participation in parish life. Unfortunately, a significant number of parishioners do not take advantage of this convenience.

In the interest of savings, we will no longer mail envelopes to those who have not used them at all in the last three years. Members of these households will **remain** parishioners, but will be considered inactive. They may be restored to active status and resume receiving envelopes if they make consistent use of the envelopes found at the entrances of both churches.

It would be helpful if the parish office would be advised when you move or when a family member goes into a long term nursing facility. Also, please note that adult children who are fully employed should register as individuals and contribute to the support of the parish, even if still living at home.

### **Witness to our Faith in the Eucharist ...in the Summer too!**

The warmer weather urges a reminder to all about proper dress for the celebration of Mass. The Catechism teaches that "Bodily demeanor (gestures, clothing) ought to convey the respect, solemnity, and joy of the moment when Christ becomes our guest." (#1387) The late Archbishop May, of St. Louis, wrote: "Once upon a time we had pastors who used to upbraid parishioners who came to church without suit coats, and women with "hankies" or tissues on their heads were regularly denounced. That was a bit extreme. But have we hit the other extreme in the casual clothing we see at Mass in some churches today? Jesus was very insistent about proper reverence in God's house. Are we? Our dress conveys the importance and dignity we attach to something or someone. What of our encounter with the Lord of heaven and earth? Dignified dress has a witness value to our brothers and sisters, sending the message that Mass is the most important part of my week. Let us be more reflective about the choices we make about Mass,

avoiding that attire which is meant for the beach and health club or gym! Think about it!

## *Help OLS School by Buying and Using "Scrip"*

### **What is Scrip?**

SCRIP cards are actually gift cards that give a percentage of the face value of the card back to the program (the percent depends on the vendor and the amount purchased). You, as the purchaser, receive full value for your money; the vendor is actually making the donation to the school.

The gift cards are available for a wide variety of restaurants and stores, and make great gifts in addition to being handy for personal use. You're likely going to patronize these establishments anyway, so why not help the school at the same time (and at no cost to you)?

### **Who can purchase Scrip?**

Anyone can purchase Scrip—parishioners, non-parishioners, school families, friends, relatives, neighbors, and co-workers.

### **What is ShopWithScrip.com?**

ShopWithScrip.com is the new online ordering system that the school will use to gather your scrip orders. This new site offers you convenience—you can now order scrip from any internet-connected computer at home, school or office.

### **Who can use ShopWithScrip?**

Anyone can use ShopWithScrip—however, to place orders, you have to create a free account at ShopWithScrip.com and identify yourself as a member of our organization with the enrollment code shown below.

### **How to register**

To register with ShopWithScrip, first open up your web browser, and go to [www.shopwithscrip.com](http://www.shopwithscrip.com). To register a new account, go to the orange **Member's Login** box on the right side, and click "Not a member? - Click Here." Follow the simple registration instructions and accept the terms and conditions of using the site.

The next screen you will see is called "join an organization". Before you can place an order, you must join by entering our enrollment code: **9L6A3F3F68L3**. By associating this code with your newly-created account, the ShopWithScrip system will associate your shopping activity with OLS School.

### **Using ShopWithScrip.com**

You can manage your account through the Account Dashboard. To access your Dashboard, click on the fifth tab, "My Account", at the top of any page. From here, you can check your account activity, change your profile and password, add, remove, and modify organizations you belong to and read coordinator and site announcements.

### **Ordering Scrip**

To order scrip, navigate to the order page by clicking "Order Scrip" at the top of any page ShopWithScrip has hundreds of different retail brands, so the order page organizes products by category. Some categories may have several pages of selections. To find a product, jump to the appropriate section, or enter all or part of the retailer name in the search box. You can also download a complete list of all products as a handy reference.

Select items and quantities on the worksheet, and press the "add to cart" button to add them to your shopping cart. Click the "check out" button when you have completed your selections. Review your order, and press the "finish" button to submit your order. (If you do not have access to the Internet, order forms are available at the school.)

Finally, you will see an "order confirmation page". Print this order confirmation page, and submit it with your check, made payable to **OLS SCRIP** by 10:00 a.m. on Wednesdays; orders will be processed every Thursday. The order confirmation page will also give you the opportunity to tell us how you would like to receive your order.

Orders will be available for pick-up the following week. During the summer, the school is open for order pick-up from 8:15 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., Monday through Thursday. On Fridays and Saturdays, orders may be picked up at the Parish Office between 9:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.
