Next Week in the Liturgy...

The celebration of the Ordinal Sundays after Pentecost next week (24th Sunday) gives way to the great Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This feast goes back to the year 335, when churches in Jerusalem, built on the sites of the Lord's crucifixion and resurrection, were dedicated. These churches became the goal of pilgrimage. In fact, the 40 days between the feast of the Transfiguration (August 6) and this Feast became a time of pilgrimage and prayer to welcome the autumn season. In some Eastern Churches, the feast is also a fast day, like Good Friday. In the presence of the Tree of Paradise, no one eats. Adam and Eve's sin of eating the fruit of the tree is not repeated this day!

The following day, we continue the feast of the Holy Cross in company with Mary, the sorrowful Mother, and patroness of our parish. The liturgy includes the moving "Sequence," a hymn of the thirteenth century "Stabat Mater" which we often sing during the Stations of the Cross ("At the Cross her station keeping...").

Holy Father's September Prayer Intentions

General: That those who are forced to leave home and country because of war or oppressive regimes may be supported by Christians in the defense and protection of their rights.

Mission: That faithful to the sacrament of matrimony every Christian family may cultivate the values of love and communion in order to be a small evangelizing community, sensitive and open to the material and spiritual needs of others.

Did You Know . . . ?

In 2006, the world's 1.131 billion Catholics—up from 1.045 billion in 2000—accounted for 17.3 percent of the population. The least dynamic continent in terms of growth was Europe which, although 25 percent of the world's Catholics reside there, registered less than a 1 percent increase. The growth rate of Africa's Catholic population, 12.4 percent, was the most dynamic. That continent accounts for 14 percent of the world total, while Catholics in the Americas (North and South) increased by 8.4 percent and comprise 50 percent of the total.

The number of bishops—70 percent of whom are in Europe and America—increased 7.6 percent, from 4,541 in 2000 to 4,898 in 2006.

The number of priests, on the other hand, increased by only 0.51 percent, from 405,178 in 2000 to 407,262 in 2006. Their numbers decreased by approximately 5 percent in Europe and Oceania and remained stable in the Americas. Africa and Asia registered increases of 23 and 18 percent, respectively.

Permanent deacons—98 percent of whom minister in Europe and the Americas—rose from 27,824 in 2000 to 34,520 in 2006, a 24 percent increase.

Professed men religious (55,057 in 2000; 55,107 in 2006) remained almost stable, while the number of professed women religious declined from 800,000 to 750,000 over the same period.

Though their number in Europe decreased by 16 percent in Europe, worldwide the number of seminarians rose by 4.43 percent, from 110,583 in 2000 to 115,000 in 2006.
