### *From the Pastor's Desk*

Dear Parishioners:

This week's message seeks to draw your attention to both the spiritual and the temporal in the life of our parish.

In the realm of the spiritual, I hope that many parishioners and friends will avail themselves of the grace of the Sacrament of Anointing that will be celebrated within the Mass this Saturday, October 18, at 11:00 a.m. at Our Lady of Sorrows Church. I am very grateful that our own Fr. Gene will celebrate this liturgy and administer this sacrament of healing. Refreshments will follow in the church hall. I will be unable to attend this celebration since I will be conducting a Day of Recollection for the Religious Teachers Filippini at Villa Walsh in Morristown. I ask for your prayers that day that my words may be of benefit to these good Sisters, whose mission is primarily that of teaching.

In "matters temporal," I am pleased to report that we have opened the bids for the roof replacement of Our Lady of Sorrows Church. The contract will soon be awarded and I will be pleased to share with you the details of the project. We are also looking to replace the aging air conditioning system of the church to one that will be more energy efficient and cost effective. These two projects will be undertaken together since the majority of the units are rooftop. Significant savings should result from these improvements since insulation of the roof and air conditioning duct work will be installed. We are currently losing much energy.

The elevator project for Saint Anthony Church is still awaiting the soil test results and the finalization of drawings. Once completed, we will commence the bidding process for construction.

We find ourselves nearly midway through the Month of the Rosary. May this Gospel prayer draw us into closer union with Our Lord and His Mother.

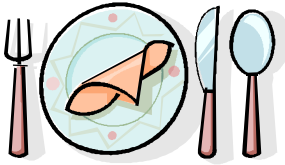
### **Beginning Experience Weekend**

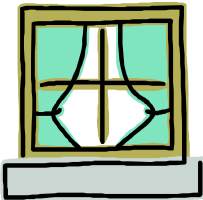

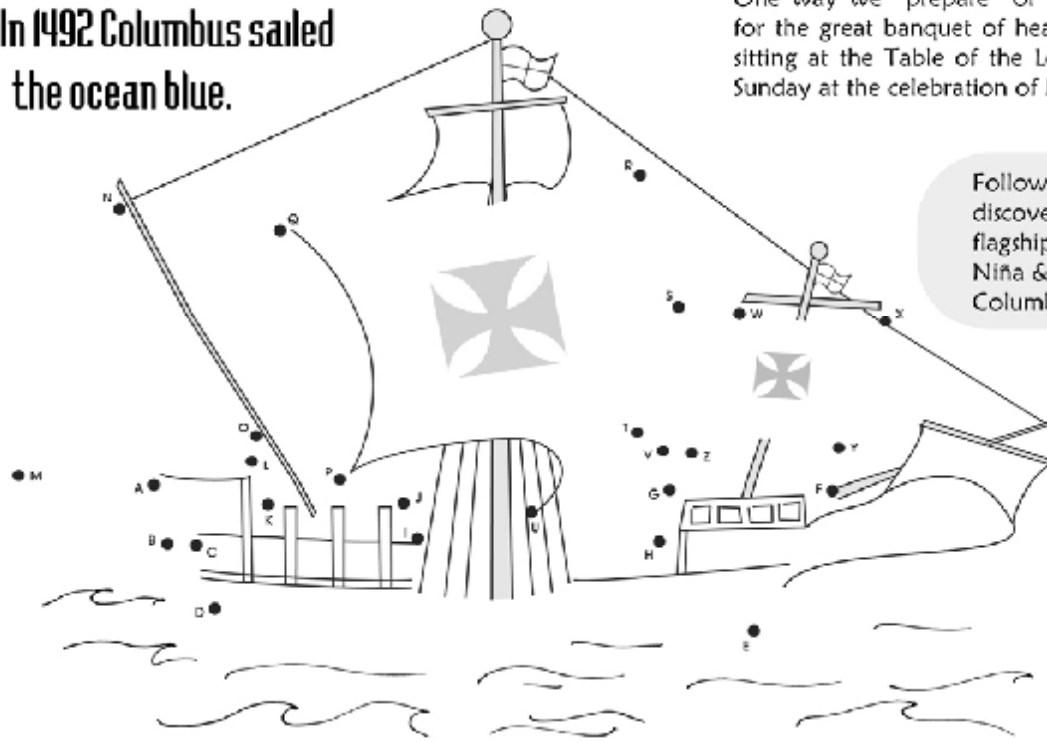
