Dear Parishioners:

Today we observe with the Church Universal, "World Mission Sunday." It provides us with the opportunity to pray fervently for the clergy, religious, and laity who, faithful to the will of God, leave their native countries so that the Gospel might be planted and grow in every part of the world. Let us pray, too, that the ranks of such missionaries will increase. Perhaps the Lord will call someone from our own parish to this vocation! In addition to our prayer, the Church urges us to contribute to support of this work. Our generous gift today will go a long way to helping a missionary in this apostolate. Support of the Church's missionary activity is not an "optional extra" but is an essential part of what it means to be truly Catholic. The Church is missionary by its very nature. The late Archbishop Fulton Sheen, longtime director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith in the U.S., offered a prayer that we can indeed make our own today: "*May the Holy Spirit teach us that the word is on our back as a Cross was on the back of Christ. Christ did not die for our parish or our dioceses. He died for ALL mankind!*"

Please continue your prayers for our young parishioners who will soon be confirmed. Over these days they are preparing for this sacrament by participating in a retreat and through sacramental confession. The celebration of Confirmation will take place on the Solemnity of All Saints, Saturday, November 1, at 11:00 a.m., with Msgr. John K. Dermond as celebrant.

November 2 – "All Souls Day" Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed

The liturgy of Sunday, November 2, will be that of the Faithful Departed (All Souls Day) and not that of the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time. On this day, and throughout November, we are urged "to remember our brothers and sisters who have gone to their rest." (Eucharistic Prayer II)

Forming Our Conscience

"The inviolability of the person, which is a reflection of the absolute inviolability of God, finds its primary and fundamental expression in the inviolability of human life. Above all, the common outcry, which is justly made on behalf of human rights—for example, the right to health, to home, to work, to family, to culture—**is false and illusory** if the right to life, the most basic and fundamental right and condition of all other personal rights, is not defended with maximum determination . . ." (John Paul II, the Vocation and the Mission of the Lay Faithful in the Church and in the World, n. 38)

"Adopting a consistent ethic of life, the Catholic Church promotes a broad spectrum of issues . . . Catholic public officials are obliged to address each of these issues as they seek to build consistent policies which promote respect for the human person at all stages of life. But the 'right' in such matters can never excuse a wrong choice regarding direct attacks on innocent human life. Indeed, the failure to protect and defend life in its most vulnerable stages **renders suspect** any claims to the 'rightness' of positions in other matters affecting the poorest and least powerful of the human community." (US Bishops, Living the Gospel of Life, 1998, n. 23)

Should I base my vote on a single issue? Catholics are not single-issue voters. A candidate’s stance on any one issue is not enough to guarantee a voter’s support; however, if that issue involves an inherent evil, it may legitimately cause the voter to withhold support for that candidate.

What should Catholics be guided by when we vote? Catholics are obliged to “build a more just and peaceful world through morally acceptable means, so that the weak and vulnerable are protected and human rights and dignity are defended” (FC20).

Abortion, infanticide, euthanasia, and genocide all involve the taking of innocent human lives, so there is no good reason to support candidates or legislation that allow these evils. Torture, racism, unjust discrimination, and the targeting of noncombatants in acts of terror or war also violate human rights, while the cloning of humans and the destruction of human embryos (e.g., in embryonic stem cell research) also violate human dignity and destroy human lives.

Catholics also need to support basic human needs as a way to build a peaceful and just world.

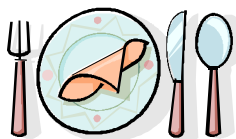
Martin House Housewares Drive In memory of Deacon Joseph Malloy Weekend of October 25 & 26

Holy Father's October Prayer Intentions

General: That the Synod of Bishops may help bishops and theologians as well as catechists and pastoral workers engaged in the service of the Word of God transmit with courage the truth of the faith in communion with the entire Church.
