From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners:

Lent seems to be flying by! I am so grateful for the generous response you are making at the various services and to our work of charity, "Power to Save Lives!" I also want to thank all those who attended to parish mission under the direction of Bishop José Sorra! It was indeed a delight to host his visit and we are so grateful that His Excellency shared with us his faith and love over these special days. I trust that the mission was spiritually rewarding to those who attended.

At long last, it is great to see the work begin on the roof replacement for Our Lady of Sorrows Church. The project will take a few weeks and will provide extensive insulation that was sorely lacking. This should realize savings in our energy bills. As mentioned in previous bulletins, the project also involves replacing our aging air conditioning units and replacing its deteriorating duct work which also brings a savings in energy costs. Once the new roof is installed, we shall be looking at undertaking a "facelift" to the church's interior. This will not involve structural changes of any kind but will enhance the church's overall appearance. Funds for this purpose will be taken from the capital campaign and not from general operational account.

Speaking of energy, I offer my apologies to those who attended the morning masses at Our Lady of Sorrows last Sunday. It seems that our heater and its thermostat settings are "on the blink" again. It is very frustrating to deal with such a "temperamental" system! We are of course, looking into the needed repairs.

Let us prepare well for Holy Week and join together to worship the Lord with reverence and love.
