Since the earliest days of the Church, Mary has been, after Jesus, the most popular subject of Christian art and spirituality. This retreat will take a fresh look at her traditional roles and titles and offer ways for us to re-discover Mary, not just as a companion and soul-friend, but as a very integral part of our life journey. In saying yes to the creator, Mary teaches us how to be creative and prophetic. Using titles from traditional prayers such as the Litany of Loreto, his own paintings of Black Madonnas, and some creative exercises, Brother Mickey will shed new light on the feminine face of God.

Brother Mickey is an Oblate of St. Francis de Sales who paints pictures, tells stories, and speaks at retreats and religious education conferences around the country. For the past two years, he has been Artist-in-Residence at the Washington Theological Union and for twenty years has taught art and prayer workshops at the Grunewald Guild, an ecumenical art community in Leavenworth, WA. He also creates art for many of today's leading Catholic publishers. His most recent book is *Jesus A to Z*, a children's ABC book with a catechetical focus. It was published in 2007 by World Library Publications, who also published his two award-winning books, *At the Name of Jesus* and *Blessed Art Thou*, which present his painted reflections on Jesus and Mary.
