## ***A Life-Saving Gift***

Pope John Paul II's 1995 encyclical on the value and inviolability of human life, *Evangelium Vitae*, teaches us that

"As part of the spiritual worship acceptable to God (cf. Rom 12:1), the Gospel of life is to be celebrated above all in daily living, which should be filled with self-giving love for others. In this way, our lives will become a genuine and responsible acceptance of the gift of life and a heartfelt song of praise and gratitude to God who has given us this gift. This is already happening in the many different acts of selfless generosity, often humble and hidden, carried out by men and women, children and adults, the young and the old, the healthy and the sick.

"It is in this context, so humanly rich and filled with love, that heroic actions too are born. These are the most solemn celebration of the Gospel of life, for they proclaim it by the total gift of self. They are the radiant manifestation of the highest degree of love, which is to give one's life for the person loved (cf. Jn 15:13). They are a sharing in the mystery of the Cross, in which Jesus reveals the value of every person, and how life attains its fullness in the sincere gift of self. Over and above such outstanding moments, there is an everyday heroism, made up of gestures of sharing, big or small, which build up an authentic culture of life. A particularly praiseworthy example of such gestures is the donation of organs, performed in an ethically acceptable manner, with a view to offering a chance of health and even of life itself to the sick who sometimes have no other hope."

We salute parishioner Sean Flanagan, recent donor of a kidney to his brother, James, whose kidneys had not functioned for a year, requiring him to undergo frequent dialysis in order to survive. Sean's wife, Danielle, reports that both men are home and recovering nicely.

Living organ donation has become a common source of organs for those in need of organ transplantation. There are thousands of living donors every year. For information about becoming a living organ donor, visit [www.livingdonorsonline.org](http://www.livingdonorsonline.org).

In New Jersey, the Uniform Anatomical Gift Act allows a consenting individual to donate his or her organs and tissues upon death for the purpose of transplantation or medical research by designating the words "Organ Donor" to appear on your NJ driver license or non-driver identification card. This designation is for individuals 18 or older; under age 18 requires consent of a parent or guardian.

**SUMMARY OF DIOCESAN FINANCIAL AUDIT**  
**Parish of Our Lady of Sorrows-St. Anthony**  
**Conducted March 17-April 2, 2009**

**GENERAL FINDINGS**

Parish financial management received a **satisfactory** rating indicating compliance with most of the diocesan internal controls established to safeguard parish assets and enhance the accuracy and reliability of the accounting records. The diocesan Director of Finance commends the parish on improvements made in its internal controls since the previous audit (Jan. 2007). The report describes the parish as “financially stable” and “debt free”...with a 311 student K-8 school and 88 student pre-school. It notes the slow decline in school enrollment and a “thriving” Pre-School. It also reports a decrease in the collection revenue since the last audit: from a \$23,000 weekly average to \$19,000.

The parish employs a CPA firm to review the general ledger and bank statements/reconciliations. The bookkeepers were described as “very diligent” and “extremely knowledgeable in all areas under their responsibility.” It noted the pastor’s “close involvement” in all areas of fiscal management and the work of a “proactive” finance council.

The audit found all revenue duly posted to the ledger and reported on the annual report. All transfers of funds were traced and supported by documentation. A second signature is also required for all checks over \$5,000. The investment mix of parish funds was described as “conservative.” 100% of school funds were cash equivalents. Parish funds were 43% in stock and mutual funds, the remainder in bonds or cash equivalents. It also noted the significant parish assets realized by the leasing of buildings at St. Anthony site.

The auditor found that all concerns raised in the 2007 audit had been addressed and corrected. “Overall, internal controls are very good at Our Lady of Sorrows-St. Anthony,” the report states.

**RECOMMENDATIONS**

Two specific recommendations were made and immediately implemented. The first concerned a revision of the Sunday collection report form used at St. Anthony. The other was a separation of duties for those handling tuition

**CONCERNS**

The audit reported the following with regard to the parish subsidy to the school:

Tuition funded 74% of salaries & benefits whilst diocesan guidelines state that tuition fund at least 90% of this cost. The parish subsidized 24% of the 07-08 budget which increases to 29% in 08-09. The subsidy was 39% of Sunday collections in 07-08 and will exceed 53% of collections in 08-09.
