At this writing, township officials are studying the permit applications. Our architect and construction firm are anxious to begin this long awaited and much needed project. Please be aware that the construction area will be “fenced off” for safety. This also necessitates the temporary closing of the driveway along aside the church.

### **Our Lady of Sorrows Interior Renovation**

The roof and air conditioning project nearly complete. The project has had a slower pace than anticipated due to township requirements and for what seemed to be an inordinate number of “rainy days.” We shall soon work on the interior of the church. For the next few months we shall have to “worship more closely together” as we undertake the work of painting and installing new ceilings and flooring. We shall all have to sacrifice a little during this period. The pews will be removed and sent off for restoration.

A sample of a newly restored pew will soon be placed in the church, giving everyone a glimpse of what we can expect.

We thank everyone for their generosity and for their understanding at this time. Think of it all as a temporary inconvenience for a permanent improvement.
