From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Many thanks for your kind blessings and prayers on the observance of "World Priest Day" last Sunday. The special invocation included in the Masses last weekend took all the priests by surprise! A pleasant and most gratifying surprise it was! Let us continue our prayers for priests as we move along through this special "Year for Priests" promulgated by the Holy Father. With this in mind, I would like to remind you that our First Thursday for Priests falls this week—November 5. You will recall that in our parish we have been setting aside the First Thursdays of the month during this year long observance for a more intense prayer for priests. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will follow the 8:00 a.m. Mass this Thursday at St. Anthony's and will conclude with Evening Prayer and Benediction at 6:30 p.m. There will also be an opportunity for sacramental confession between 6:00 and 6:30 p.m. Please set some time aside with the Lord this Thursday!

The final asbestos abatement took place last week and work continues on the interior renovation of Our Lady of Sorrows Church. Once the two transepts or "wings" are suitable for "occupancy," we will dispense with the additional Sunday Masses in the hall and return to the usual schedule. Our architect and contractors are working diligently to make the entire church ready for Christmas. We are looking to move to the wings in a couple weeks. There is not much to report on the elevator project except to state that the work continues. We are looking to a completion date at the end of January.

Thanks to those who are responding with such generosity to our final appeal for the capital campaign. These difficult economic times makes our gratitude all the more profound.

As we enter the month dedicated to the faithful departed, let us remember to keep our beloved deceased in prayer that they might come to the joy of heaven.



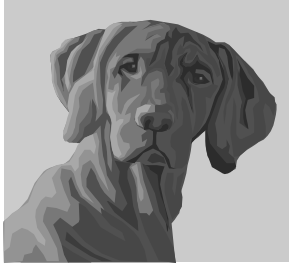
