From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Today's Solemnity of Christ the King is a fitting celebration for the final week of the liturgical year. It has been called by one author, "an Easter in autumn," anticipating for us the Second Coming of Christ in power and majesty. We see this in the imagery of the first and second readings (Dan 7: 13-14 and Rev 1: 5-8) and our Lord's proclamation before Pilate that his kingdom "does not belong to this world." (John 18:33-37) The Second Vatican Council teaches: "The expectation of a new earth must not weaken but rather stimulate our concern for cultivating this one. For here grows the body of a new human family, a body which even now is able to give some kind of foreshadowing of the new age." We should then have an active concern for the well being of others, especially the neediest. Our annual parish Advent project, *Adopt a Family*, is one way we can realize this. I hope that this worthy endeavor receives an enthusiastic response! It is an admirable tradition that marks our parish life! The Gospel teaches us that when the Lord does come in His glory, He will also judge us on the love we have shown throughout our lives: "Whatsoever you do to the least of my brothers and sisters, you do to me."

Let us celebrate Thanksgiving in the most appropriate way—offering together the Eucharist! Our Mass on this national day of gratitude to the Triune God will be offered at St. Anthony Church at 9:00 a.m. Everyone is also invited to join the Ecumenical Service to be held at Pearson Memorial United Methodist Church on Wednesday at 7:30 p.m.

Renovation Update

Our Lady of Sorrows Church

We move this weekend into our nearly completed transepts. Surely the pews, at least on this occasion, are a welcome change from the metal folding chairs, as is the improved lighting. Soon to be included are various sanctuary appointments, the shrine to Our Lady of Sorrows and the images of the Saints. The central nave is now closed for its facelift. Our contractors have discovered on the first day of work in this area, that the back wall (under the choir loft encasing the confessionals) had a number of structural defects and extensive water damage to the walls, especially in the corners. This has already been corrected. The nave will see a number of changes: refurbished confessions, painting, ceiling panels and enhanced lighting...and of course, restored pews!

On Thanksgiving morning, there will be a 9:00 a.m. Mass at St. Anthony's site. Blessed loaves of bread will be distributed for you to share with your family on this special day.

Thanksgiving Sharing

Once again, our parish Social Justice/Social Concerns Committee will be collecting canned goods and non-perishable items to fill Thanksgiving baskets for Mount Carmel Guild and Martin House. We ask you to bring food for a Thanksgiving Day meal, such as **frozen** turkeys, potatoes, vegetables, stuffing, gravy mix, and dessert. We can also use gift certificates from local grocery stores or cash donations, which will be used to supplement the items donated to make complete meals. Please bring your donations to the Martin House truck in the parking lot of Our Lady of Sorrows Church and St. Anthony's Church at all Masses on the weekend of Nov. 21- 22. Last year, 178 turkeys and 262 bags of groceries, as well as \$264 in food certificates and \$437 in cash donations were donated by our parishioners. This year has seen many more Americans, right here in our own Hamilton and Trenton community, lose their jobs and hit on hard times. Even those still employed are struggling, especially those we refer to as the "working poor." People working full-time jobs as nurse's aides, security guards, cleaning people, receptionists, and other low-paying professions are struggling more than ever to stretch their meager paychecks to cover the rising costs of gasoline, heating oil, rent and groceries.

While times are tough for all of us, the poor need our generosity and support more than ever. Many of you remember our dear Deacon Joe Malloy, who would remind us that when we are one day called home to the Father, He will ask us what we did when we saw Him hungry, thirsty, cold, and naked in the faces of the poor. We are sure that Joe was met with open arms by our heavenly Father for all he did for the poor of Trenton. Joe always inspired us to be generous, and in his memory, let us continue to serve God by serving the poor.
