From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners:

The tragic news that has been coming to us through the media has been the cause for deep prayer and of solidarity with the people of Haiti. Our parish is home to so many who have come from that island nation; we shall want to be generous in providing assistance. I am grateful to you for the items you bring to church this weekend and for your monetary gifts that will be passed on to Catholic Relief Services.

Last Sunday, how comforting was the presence of Bishop Smith who came to St. Anthony Church to celebrate Mass with our Haitian Community. Joining the Bishop and me at the evening Mass was our own Fr. Alabré (whose brother, sister-in-law, and nephew died in the earthquake), Fr. Gene, Fr. Jay Bowden, and Msgr. Dermond. I am so grateful for the many parishioners who assisted at this Mass. Words seemed so futile as we greeted people at the end of the liturgy so many of whom told us of the family members and friends they lost in this great tragedy.

The words of Cardinal Bertone provide some consolation: *"After that cry from the Cross—'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?'—there was silence. It was a long and wearing silence, full of doubts and anguish: the silence of man permeated by suffering before the silence of God. God may seem absent, sorrow can appear a brute force and meaningless, tears dim the eyes and also seem to obscure even the most timid rays of spring sunshine. Yet it is precisely while the taunting question arises, 'Where is your God?' (Ps. 42: 41) that we feel emerging from the depths the certainty of God's loving intervention that becomes heart, hands, help—constant help, present help. Ours is a God who has a passion for man; a God who suffers with us and for us; a God who chooses silence to find a home in the arms of those who, suffering, strive to keep the torch of hope alight."*

Dear friends, thank you for being that heart, those hands, and that help—that will move Haiti, tried many a time in its history, from the darkness of Good Friday to an Easter rebirth!

A Closer Look: The Renovated Church of Our Lady of Sorrows

The Shrines to Our Lady and St. Joseph

During Christmastide, the traditional manger or crèche was located in the space intended for the shrine to Our Lady. With its removal after the holy season, a newly restored statue of the Blessed Virgin will be displayed on a pedestal, custom made by Martini Woodwork of Hamilton.

The statues of the Blessed Virgin and St. Joseph that had been in the devotional areas of the transepts were sent to DeMetz Studios, Ortisei, Italy. They were of natural linden wood and in need of cleaning and repair. DeMetz artists added "traditional colors" to these carvings that are truly transformative!

Oil paintings on canvas of Mary's seven sorrows will also compliment the new shrine. These were executed by Domenico Marrasso of Naples, Italy, exclusively for our church. These round paintings form an arch as a backdrop to the simple figure of Mary recollected in prayer. These seven sorrows of Our Lady are:

The Prophecy of Simeon

The Flight into Egypt

The Loss of Jesus in Jerusalem

Meeting Jesus on the Road to Calvary

The Crucifixion and Death of Jesus

The Descent of Jesus' Body from the Cross

Jesus is placed in the tomb

The words of Christ to St. John (and to the Church) from the cross, "Behold Your Mother," will be stenciled at the entrance of the shrine area.

St. Joseph's statue will be enshrined in the opposite transept above the baptismal font. He is depicted with his carpenter's square, as patron of workers and also with the lily, a symbol of his purity. It is appropriate that his image be in close proximity to the baptismal font, where new Christians are welcomed, since St. Joseph is Patron of the Universal Church.

The Baptismal Area

In the renovations, it was thought to bring together in one area, the baptismal furnishings. The font, as are the other furnishings, the work of Hans Martini. The graceful tapered red oak column supports a substantial font that has a brass covering. Flanking the font are the paschal candle used during the baptismal rite—symbol of the light of Christ to be shared and "kept burning brightly." This candle stand once used at St. Anthony's Church was restored for use at Our Lady of Sorrows. The paschal candle is always decorated with a cross, five wax nails denoting

the five wounds of Christ, and the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet, Alpha and Omega, referring to Christ, the beginning and the end.

The ambry (the box) for the custody of the holy oils has been refinished by Mr. Martini to blend with the current woodwork. The holy oils of Sacred Chrism, the Oil of Catechumens and the Oil of the Sick are used during the celebration of the sacraments. The new vessels for these oils were created by Serpone Studios, Rome.

It’s So Easy

It’s a simple thing to make a good Confession – you just name your sin and confess it to the priest. Here are some pitfalls to avoid.

- Avoid confessing other people’s sins. ‘My friend, wife, husband, etc. makes me so mad because they are always doing such and such, and, etc, ...’
- Avoid telling the priest how good you are. ‘I’m really a good person. I do my job at work and look after my wife, husband, and, etc. ...’
- Avoid telling the priest which sins you don’t commit. ‘I don’t steal or lie or deliberately hurt anyone or, etc ...’
- Avoid telling the priest you ‘might have’ committed some sins. ‘Perhaps I could have been more kind, and maybe I could have been more honest, perhaps, and, etc ...’
- Avoid confessing all the minor sins first and then the big ones at the end. Confess the ones you don’t want to confess – first.
- Avoid ‘generic’ confessions. ‘I’ve been a bit bad and not as nice as I could have been, and, etc ...’
- Avoid giving yourself advice – let the priest do that. ‘I know I will have to begin to pray more, and maybe if I made an effort to balance my prayer life with my work, etc, ...’
- Avoid confessing to yourself. ‘I feel I have let myself down and find it difficult to forgive myself. I must learn to be more true to myself and, etc ...’
- Avoid unnecessary detail. ‘Well, it was Tuesday, no Wednesday at 4pm and I was with my little sister at the park and we saw this woman who was walking along the path, actually, maybe it was Tuesday after all, yes, I think it was, etc ...’
- Avoid minimising (sic) your sins. ‘I only have small sins, like, you know, sins that everyone has, the normal sins, etc ...’

Making a good confession is not difficult really, it just needs some quiet time to prepare and then, as they say, *name* your sins and *claim* your sins. ‘Father, I’ve been taking things home from work, small things, but it’s still stealing.’ ‘Father, I’ve had an abortion. I have come to realise (sic) how wrong it was and I want to ask God’s forgiveness.’ ‘Father, I’ve been missing Mass through laziness and I took Holy Communion twice, knowing it was wrong to do so.’

Simple? Go for it!!
