Ongoing Work . . . Renovation Update

Our Lady of Sorrows Church

- ✓ **Candles:** Devotional lights are located in the room in the east transept (at the entrance), behind the statue of Blessed Teresa of Calcutta.
- ✓ **Shrine of the Blessed Virgin:** The refurbished statue of Our Lady arrived some weeks ago, but we are awaiting the completion of its pedestal, an exclusive creation for OLS by Hans Martini. The Shrine of Our Lady will be located in the west transept, in the area formerly used for the Blessed Sacrament. The shrine will include oil paintings of Our Lady's Seven Sorrows.
- ✓ **Image of St. Joseph:** The refurbished statue will be placed in the baptismal alcove.
- ✓ **The Baptismal Font:** This exclusive creation by Hans Martini will be placed near the alcove (formerly the site of the Holy Family statue)
- ✓ **The Holy Oils Ambry:** The container for the display of the sacramental oils is being refinished by Mr. Martini. It will be placed in the baptismal area next to the paschal candle. The vessels for the Holy Oils are new items obtained from Serpone & Co., Rome.
- ✓ **The Stations of the Cross:** The "Via Crucis" that have been in the adoration chapel will soon be hung on the walls of the nave. Mr. Martini is providing the red wood crosses for the stations.
- ✓ **Confessionals:** Screens to provide the opportunity for "face to face" confession and preserve the right to anonymity will be installed. Crucifixes also will be added.
- ✓ **Tree of Life:** The tree will be relocated at a church entrance and positioned in such a way to enable names and dedications to be read.
- ✓ **Church Entrances / Vestibules / Choir Loft:** Enhancements will be made to these areas, especially in those areas where deteriorated plaster remains.

St. Anthony Church

- ✓ **The Elevator:** This addition is nearly complete, requiring "testing" and final township inspection.
- ✓ **The Hall:** Final touches are being made. The stage floor has been refinished. New lighting has been installed.
- ✓ **Restroom facilities:** Extensive repairs to plumbing have been made and new fixtures have been installed.
- ✓ **Church:** The upgrade to the sound system has proven to be a great benefit to hearing and discerning the spoken word.

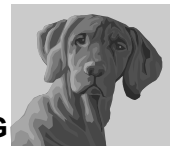
