Renovation Update

Our Lady of Sorrows Church

Since the solemn dedication of the church in March, our updates have appeared less frequently in the bulletin, but this doesn't mean that work has ceased. Here is an update on a few items:

Pew/Kneeler Repairs and Adjustment—Last week, workmen undertook a process of repairs and adjustments to the kneelers and pews. Through past bulletins, we expressed our concern and indeed dissatisfaction with the quality of installation of new kneelers. This was a part of the renovation contracted independently of the general contractor, who is not responsible for this aspect of the renovation. It was our intent to restore the pews in order to retain what we could and save money. Frankly, the work could have been much better. This is why we have undertaken a number of corrective measures for the greater comfort of all who worship. We apologize for the inconveniences and hope that the work now done will be a very welcome improvement.

Peace Garden Upgrade—Work was recently completed on the peace garden behind the church, adjacent to the elevator entrance. This area required not only a cleaning but regarding and the installation of drainage in order to stop water damage to the basement. The wall of the Music Room was subject to extensive water damage.

Choir Loft and Vestibules—We are delaying work needed in these areas for the time being as we study the best and most economical way to repair and enhance them.

Adoration Chapel

In commemoration of the 25th anniversary of Eucharistic Adoration in the parish, we are seeking to make needed improvements in the Chapel: new carpeting, cleaning, and lighting. For the comfort of those who devote many hours to prayer, we want to include pew cushions. Anyone willing to make a donation to this project, to take place over the summer, can simply mail a gift to the rectory marked "Chapel Work" or drop the gift in the Sunday collection.

Marian Mediations for May

Mary – “Sedes Sapientiae” the Seat of Wisdom.

Mary has this title in her Litany because the Son of God, who is also called in Scripture the Word and the Wisdom of God, once dwelt in her and then, after his birth of her, was carried in her arms and seated in her lap in his first years. Thus, being, as it were, the human throne of him who reigns in heaven.

But the possession of her Son lasted beyond his infancy—He was under her rule, as St. Luke tells us, and live with her in her house, till he went forth to preach—that is, for at least a whole thirty years...For if such close and continued intimacy with her Son created in her a sanctity inconceivably great, must not also the knowledge which she gained during those many years from his conversation of present, past, and future have been so large, and so profound, and so diversified, and so thorough, that though she was a poor woman without human advantages, she must in her knowledge of creation, of the universe, and of history, have excelled the greatest of philosophers, and in her theological knowledge the greatest of theologians, and in her prophetic discernment the most favored of prophets?

What was the grand theme of conversation between her and her Son but the nature, the attributes, the providence, and the works of Almighty God? ...Moses had the privilege only now and then, from time to time; but Mary for thirty continuous years saw and heard him, being all through that time face to face with him, and being able to ask him any question which she wished explained, and knowing that the answers she received were from the Eternal God, who neither deceives nor can be deceived.

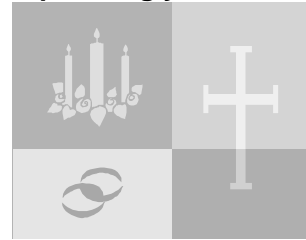


It's This Weekend!

Eucharistic Adoration

Practice established by Msgr. Edward O'Keefe in 1985.
Adoration takes place in the Chapel of Mary's Haven.

What is the difference between Eucharistic adoration and Eucharistic exposition?

Eucharistic adoration is prayer before the Blessed Sacrament housed within the tabernacle. Eucharistic exposition is the ritual by which the Blessed Sacrament is displayed outside the tabernacle in a monstrance or ciborium for public veneration by the faithful. It is a public celebration that enables the faithful to perceive more clearly the relationship between the reserved Sacrament and the "sacrifice of the Mass [which] is truly the origin and the purpose of the worship that is shown to the Eucharist outside Mass."
