From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners:

Today's Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (more often called by its Latin names, *Corpus Christi* or *Corpus Domini*) provides us with the opportunity to celebrate the gift and mystery of the Holy Eucharist with a joy and solemnity that would be out of character during Holy Week. First celebrated in France in 1247, the observance then spread throughout the Church. It is marked in many places by grant processions. Centuries later the Council of Trent would explain that *Corpus Christi* is celebrated to **elicit our gratitude and counter our forgetfulness.**

Today we offer thanks and praise to the Lord who willed to give Himself to us under the form of bread and wine. This gift is our spiritual nourishment, the divine food for our earthy journey.

Yet, how often we can become so accustomed to this Divine Gift, with the result that our attitude and our reception can become all too familiar and routine. It would be easy to forget the treasure we possess. This feast challenges us to greater reverence and love. Might I suggest a few simple ways we can do this as individuals and as a parish family.

✓ **Prayerful Preparation:**

We should receive the Lord with minds and hearts renewed. We should recall the necessity of sacramental confession before receiving Communion when aware of any serious or mortal sins. We should recall the Eucharistic fast of one hour that should precede our Holy Communion.

✓ **Witnessing to the Real Presence**

The Lord remains present in the Blessed Sacrament within the tabernacle of the church. We should acknowledge this Presence by our reverent deportment within the church. Let us work together to create a climate of quiet, which is an aid to prayer. How awesome is the silence we are asked to maintain at certain events. I recall the silence of hundreds of people witnessing the reverent "changing of the guard" at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Arlington. It was a call to respect and honor. What of the Lord in His Eucharistic Presence? A genuflection (or bow when genuflecting is not possible) is also a way to witnessing to the Presence of the Lord in our midst.

✓ **Thanksgiving**

Upon approaching Holy Communion, our response being presented the "Body of Christ" and "Blood of Christ" is a fervent "Amen," a simple one-word profession of faith...no more and no less. Upon returning to our places, we should spend some moments in private prayer, thanking the Lord for coming to us.

Masses of the Weekend of June 12-13

The Church allows a parish to observe the feast day of its patron and the "titular" of its church as a "solemnity," a celebration of the highest liturgical rank. On such days, the prescribed Mass texts may be replaced with those of the holy patron. This is indeed the case next weekend, when St. Anthony's Day falls on Sunday. We would like all to be aware that as a community dedicated to Our Lady and St. Anthony, we shall be celebrating St. Anthony Day as a parish "Solemnity" at both our churches. Thus, the Scripture readings and Mass texts will be those of St. Anthony and not of the 11th Sunday of Ordinary Time.

What significance does this reservation of the Eucharist (in the tabernacle) have for the life of Catholics?

"Eucharist is reserved in churches or oratories to serve as the spiritual center of a religious community or a parish community, indeed of the whole Church and the whole of mankind, since it contains, beneath the veil of the species, Christ, the invisible Head of the Church, the Redeemer of the world, the center of all hearts, 'by whom all things are and by whom we exist.' He is in the midst of us day and night; He dwells in us with the fullness of grace and of truth. He raises the level of morals, fosters virtue, comforts the sorrowful, strengthens the weak and stirs up all those who draw near to Him to imitate Him, so that they may learn from his example to be meek and humble of heart, and to seek not their own interests but those of God."

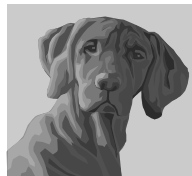

Pope Benedict....On Sports

Through sports activities, the ecclesial community contributes to the formation of youth, offering an appropriate ambit for its human and spiritual growth. In fact, when they are directed to the integral development of the person and are managed by qualified and competent personnel, sports initiatives reveal themselves as propitious occasions in which priests, religious and laity can become true and proper educators and teachers of life of young people. Hence, it is necessary that, in our time—in which we see the urgent need to educate the new generations—the Church continue to support sports for young people, fully appreciating also competitive activity in its positive aspects, as for example, in the capacity to stimulate competitiveness, courage and tenacity in the pursuit of objectives avoiding, however, all tendencies that pervert its very nature with recourse to practices that are also dangerous to the organism, as is the case of doping. In a coordinated formative action, Catholic leaders, technicians and operators must be considered experienced guides for adolescents, helping them to develop their own competitive potentialities without neglecting the human qualities and Christian virtues which make the person completely mature.
