Dear Parishioners,

We come to the last days of June, a month dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a symbol of the Lord's tremendous love and mercy. Clothes say something about what we think, what we value. They also influence how we behave and feel. That our culture has become so casual about everything says something about us. I cannot exactly articulate it but it seems to say, “*Nothing is really all that important.*” But that is not true. Going to God’s house IS important. Being ministered to by the King of Kings and Lord of Lords is astounding. Casual attire in these circumstances is simply inappropriate if we really think about what we are doing, where we are going, and who it is we will meet. It does not necessarily follow that we must wear tuxedos and formal gowns. But decent semi-formal attire seems wholly appropriate. Sunday is special; God’s House is special. Some things really ARE important and our clothing and demeanor ought to reflect this truth.

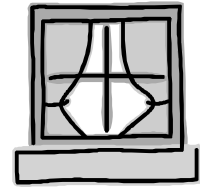
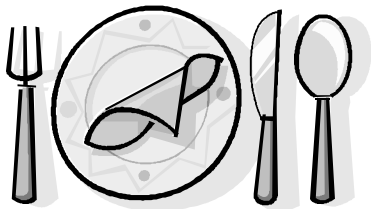
