Father Sostenes Romeo Tuctuc Roquel will be speaking at all masses next weekend, describing the work of and requesting support for his Society, the Missionary Fraternity of Mary of Guatemala. He has been invited to our parish by the Society for the Propagation of the Faith of our Diocese of Trenton.

Begun in 1981 as a youth ministry with seven young men, the Fraternity was subsequently established as a Society for Apostolic Life in 1990. Since then it has grown to a Society of 150 ordained priests serving 60 missions in 27 dioceses in 10 countries. Currently there are approximately 175 seminarians in various stages of formation at the seminary in Guatemala.

Fraternity mission sites are established where there are no clergy to fulfill pastoral needs, in difficult economic areas, and among the poor and emarginated. Please welcome Father Sostenes and be as generous as you can in support of his work,

Getting Ready for the New Roman Missal

What's new or different about the revised translation?

The style of the translation of the Third Edition is different. In accord with the rules for translation established by the Holy See, the revised translation follows the style of the original Latin texts more closely, including concrete images, repetition, parallelisms, and rhythm. The English used in the Mass texts is more formal and dignified in style. Where possible, the texts follow the language of Scripture and include many poetic images.

In addition, the Third Edition contains prayers for the celebration of recently canonized saints, additional prefaces for the Eucharistic Prayers, additional Masses and prayers for various needs and intentions, and some updated and revised rubrics (or instructions) for the celebration of the Mass.

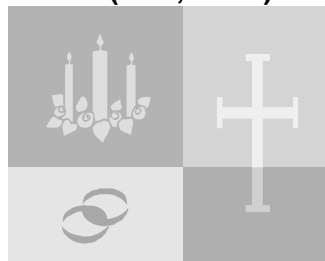
What forms might such Solemn Exposition take?

In many places, this exposition takes place for a period of "forty hours," during which the faithful join with local clergy in a continuous period of prayer for forty hours. In other places, shorter periods of continuous prayer before the exposed Blessed Sacrament take place, accompanied by appropriate sacred songs, readings from Scripture, and other forms of liturgical prayer.

Registration for Religious Education

In order to place the children in the various sessions, we ask for your cooperation in completing your registration as soon as possible. This will give us time to assign both children and Catechists to the sessions prior to September. We will be mailing all the information and Religious Education schedule to parents by the end of August. Our First Session will start on September 19, 20, and 22. What is Cherubs?

Cherubs is the name of our early childhood religious education program for three-, four- and five-year-olds.

When are classes?

Cherub classes are held in the parish elementary school in ‘age appropriate’ classroom settings.

What about class size?

Cherub class sizes are usually small (8-12 children), so learning opportunities are optimal.

Children who attend early childhood religious education classes are better prepared to begin formal religious education classes in first grade. During Cherub classes the children are introduced to Scripture stories, songs, prayers, and practices, as well as fun-filled, faith-filled crafts and activities.

Witness to our Faith in the Eucharist

The warmer weather urges a reminder to all about proper dress for the celebration of Mass. The Catechism teaches that “Bodily demeanor (gestures, clothing) ought to convey the respect, solemnity, and joy of the moment when Christ becomes our guest.” (#1387) The late Archbishop May, of St. Louis, wrote: “Once upon a time we had pastors who used to upbraid parishioners who came to church without suit coats, and women with “hankies” or tissues on their heads were regularly denounced. That was a bit extreme. But have we hit the other extreme in the casual clothing we see at Mass in some churches today? Jesus was very insistent about proper reverence in God’s house. Are we?” Our dress conveys the importance and dignity we attach to something or someone. What of our encounter with the Lord of heaven and earth? Dignified dress has a witness value to our brothers and sisters, sending the message that Mass is the most important part of my week. Let us be more reflective about the choices we make about Mass, avoiding that attire which is meant for the beach and health club or gym! Think about it!
