### What will the process of implementation look like?

Once the *recognitio* is granted, final preparation and publication of the *Missal* will commence. At that time, catachesis on the new translation and on the Liturgy itself will become even more important. Training for priests, music ministers, and other liturgical leaders (liturgy committees and liturgical commissions), as well as formation for all Catholics, will help to ensure the successful implementation of the new text.

### **May Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion be deputed to expose the Blessed Sacrament for adoration?**

Yes, "such ministers may open the tabernacle and also, if suitable, place the ciborium on the altar or place the host in the monstrance. At the end of the period of adoration, they replace the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle. It is not lawful, however, for them to give the blessing with the sacrament."

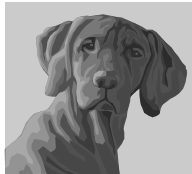

### *Witness to our Faith in the Eucharist*

The warmer weather urges a reminder to all about proper dress for the celebration of Mass. The Catechism teaches that "Bodily demeanor (gestures, clothing) ought to convey the respect, solemnity, and joy of the moment when Christ becomes our guest." (#1387) The late Archbishop John Lawrence May, of St. Louis, wrote: "Once upon a time we had pastors who used to upbraid parishioners who came to church without suit coats, and women with "hankies" or tissues on their heads were regularly denounced. That was a bit extreme. But have we hit the other extreme in the casual clothing we see at Mass in some churches today? Jesus was very insistent about proper reverence in God's house. Are we?"

Our dress conveys the importance and dignity we attach to something or someone. What of our encounter with the Lord of heaven and earth? Dignified dress has a witness value to our brothers and sisters, sending the message that Mass is the most important part of my week. Let us be more reflective about the choices we make about Mass, avoiding that attire which is meant for the beach and health club or gym! Think about it!
