From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners:

This week's message has a number of important points I would like to share about our parish life.

✓ Welcoming the New Translation of the Roman Missal

Last week, Fr. Gene and I joined nearly 250 priests from around the country at a conference on the implementation of the new translation of the Roman Missal. We found it interesting, informative and helpful. It looks very likely that the new translation will be introduced on the First Sunday of Advent in 2011. So we have a fifteen-month period to become acquainted with the new texts. While most changes affect the parts proclaimed by the celebrant, there are a number of changes for the congregation. I purchased a number of resources to guide us along the next few months of preparation. I shall be working with the deacons, liturgy committee, and music ministry to implement those suggestions that will help us appreciate and welcome the changes. I believe it is very important to explain the principal reasons why the translation was made.

The presenters at the conference also urged that these months of preparation be marked by a strong catechesis on the liturgy itself—its history and spirituality. Beginning in September, our bulletin will carry a brief history and reflection on the various parts of the Mass. Join me with open minds and hearts during this period of preparation and formation.

✓ Our Parish Picnic

✓ Back to School (Sorry I have to mention this, kids!)

We are very happy to report that we are witnessing an increase in registrations. At this point, the projected enrollment for September is 250! This is great news! Getting Ready for the New Roman Missal

Do these changes mean that the old translation was not valid and orthodox?

The current translation was approved by the Conferences of bishops and confirmed by the Holy See. Until the new text becomes effective, it remains the valid ordinary form of the Liturgy in the Roman Rite. The revised translation attempts to address some inadequacies in the present translation by introducing a more elevated style of language and by retaining many poetic texts and scriptural allusions. The current translation fostered the faith of two generations of Catholics and retains a valid place in Church history.

Eucharistic Adoration

Practice established by Msgr. Edward O'Keefe in 1985.
Adoration takes place in the Chapel of Mary's Haven.

What is the difference between perpetual adoration and perpetual exposition of the Blessed Sacrament?

The Blessed Sacrament may be adored while contained in the tabernacle for an extended period of time; this is called "perpetual adoration." Perpetual exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is a liturgical act whereby the consecrated host is placed in a ciborium or in a monstrance outside the tabernacle for an extended period of time so that the faithful may gather together to pray before the exposed Eucharist.

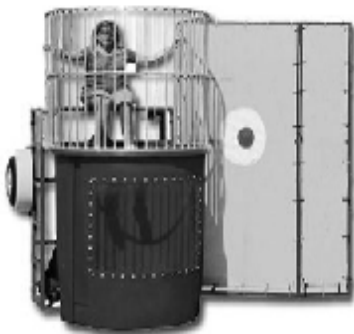

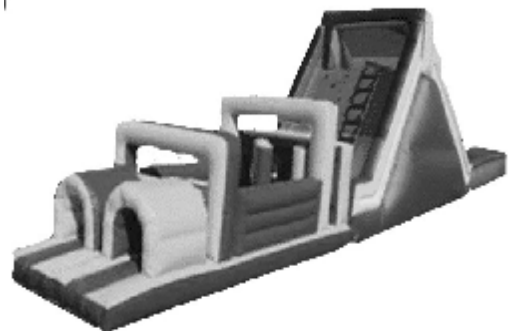
